April 2022 - Trustee Kristi Rouse - Report to School Councils

CURRICULUM

On **March 3**, Alberta School Boards Association Zone 2/3 hosted the first in a two part series of trustee engagement events to deliberate governance considerations that school divisions need to prepare for ahead of the Minister of Education's direction to implement new K-6 curriculums for English Language Arts and Literature, Mathematics and Physical Education and Wellness in September 2022. Part 2 of this series will take place on **May 2** guided by the input received from participants.

K-3 English Language Arts and Literature along with Mathematics, and K-6 Physical Education and Wellness Curriculums were made available on **April 13** so that division implementation plans, teacher professional development and resource acquisition may commence. On **April 14**, the Minister announced that a telephone town hall would be held on **April 20** at 6:30 pm to discuss release of curriculums for implementation and other education matters. Link was available here: <u>https://extranet.gov.ab.ca/opinio6/s?s=EDUC_TTH_APR20</u>

Our division is continuing to advocate for delayed mandatory implementation, and is offering to instead pilot the curriculum in 2022-23 with thorough feedback. Advocacy from parents, community members and school councils has, and will continue to be, effective and welcomed.

BUDGET

While the provincial budget was released February 24, school divisions did not receive pertinent details until March 24. Of particular interest to the division is a new requirement to maintain reserves at a specified level after August 31, 2023. This will significantly impact individual school and division operations. Information on budget details around curriculum implementation funds and post-pandemic mental health funding is still forthcoming.

<u>COVID</u>

Administration continues to closely monitor the Covid situation in schools and commenced rescheduling events that were postponed from January and February, including school education plan presentations which took place on April 11 and 14.

<u>OTHER</u>

On **April 4**, Minister LaGrange confirmed that diploma exams will be administered for the rest of the school year in April, June and August 2022, at a temporarily reduced weighting of 10% for the 2021-22 school year only. Similarly, Provincial Achievement Tests will also be held.

A presentation for parents and stakeholders by Kevin Cameron, "Understanding and Managing the Social, Emotional and Traumatic Impacts of a Worldwide Pandemic" was held Thursday, March 17 at the Arden Theatre.

Junior high open houses wrapped up on April 13.

The board will be participating in previously scheduled anti-racism training sessions in early May as well as a joint meeting between the City of St. Albert and school boards with schools within the City of St. Albert.

JMD Administration Update- March/April 2022

- **Fundraising:** Thanks for your support with ongoing campaigns, Hot lunch and Plant Drive as well as for your donations to technology, music and PE programming at JMD. Also, thank you for your support at Open House, Easter rotations, Praise Service, Field trips and in class presentations, and for the support of the Ukrainian Fundraiser was appreciated (over \$3000 raised).
- Yearbook: The year book will be published by the Digital Arts students.
- Field trips are in full swing. Great to have more experiential learning happening again.
- **Celebrations:** We will move forward with all awards at our awards night. We have decided as a staff to do awards night. June 27 at 7:00 pm.

- **Satisfaction Surveys:** We received our parent, student and staff satisfaction surveys back they have been completed by the staff, parents and grades 4-9 students. Great results overall.
- **Professional Development:** Staff has participated in lots of PD these past few weeks ATA PD Day Wellness, Karen Lucas literacy and Assessment and Indigenous ways of knowing by Sandra Herbst and Dustin Louie respectively.
- **Playground:** Estimates are underway for the placement of our bench and picnic tables.
- **Outdoor Garden:** We are planting inside in preparation for outside. We will be building more boxes for vegetables and will also be planting a Three Sisters Garden. We have bought some tools and dirt and have received some more grants to help us with our gardening endeavors.

- **Peace Poles:** These are completed by grades and will go near our K-3 playground which will be at the front of the school, north of the garbage area. The cost of this project is supported by the district (Wisdom and Guidance Committee).

Curriculum: Our district is piloting the K-3 curriculum in the areas of ELA, Math and Wellness from K-6. Our teachers will be attending sessions over the next month and a half in these areas.
