How to Purchase a Chromebook


We recommend the following:



Edmonton Police Cadet Corps

Edmonton Police Cadet program builds essential skills for youth

The Edmonton Police Cadet program instills a sense of community and citizenship in youth. The program aims to foster leadership, citizenship, pride, discipline, and challenge while acquitting youth with the foundation and connection to a career in policing.

Applications are open from April 1 - 30, 2025. The program meets at EPS' Northwest Campus (18440 127 Street NW) on Wednesday evenings.

What students will learn

- · Develop an understanding of the police
- Develop an understanding of the role of a police officer in the community
- · Develop leadership and teamwork skills
- · Build a foundation for a future career in law enforcement
- · Discover new challenges
- · Increase physical fitness
- · Have an opportunity to earn HS credits



Eligibility

In order to be eligible for the program, youth must:

- · Have an interest in policing and considering a future career in law enforcement
- Be of 14 18 years of age; No younger than 14 years of age or older than 18 years of age.
 - Please note: Applicants must be 18 years old maximum by the completion of the cadet year.
- · Have completed the application form
- Have 2 reference details (Professional, volunteer or academic reference, one must be teacher or principle); no family or friends' references
- · Be attending school full time.
- Undergo a screening process which includes an Enhanced Police Information Check. (this check includes a review of immediate family members and residents of the household)
- · Undergo a panel interview
- · Maintain a high level of integrity and demonstrate good ethical character
- · Maintain a minimum 70% attendance record with the program
- · Have Canadian citizenship or Permanent Resident status;
- · Have no criminal convictions or association with known criminals
- Be willing to volunteer time to the Edmonton Police Service in order to gain knowledge and understanding of the law and respect for police personnel
- · Able to arrange own transportation to and from NW Campus on class nights

Play

Grades 1-3

At this age, sport should be playful, exploratory and non-specialized, focusing on holistic development rather than performance. In our Grades 1-3 program we will encourage children to explore their creativity with the ball, while placing an emphasis on physical literacy.

- Physical literacy
- (coordination, agility and balance)
- Running with the ball and dribbling
- Basic ball mastery
- Lots of ball striking and lots of goal scoring
- 3v3 game play

Grades 4-6

Students will receive individual attention while working on ball mastery, 1v1 attacking and defending play, and developing their core foundational soccer skills. Games will be played in a 4v4 format to maximize both touches on the ball and opportunities to make decisions.

- Physical literacy
- Ball mastery
- 1v1 play
- Basic attacking principles (width and depth)
- Core foundational skills (passing, 1st touch, etc.)
- 4v4 game play and basic positioning
