- If your child is absent on hot lunch day (Tuesday), please complete the <u>Student Absence</u> <u>Form</u>. Complete the form no later than 11:00 am
- JMD's fundraising group appreciates your support. The form lets us know what to do with your child's food order (have it ready for pick up, have it delivered to a sibling, or no arrangements). What we can't manage is a line up of parents trying to pick up food while still preparing deliveries for classes. Food for absent students will not be set aside unless this form is completed. Pick ups must be after 1:00 pm. Your cooperation is appreciated!



Math-a-thon Information

- The Math-a-thon has been organized to help raise funds for related learning resources.
- You are asked to pledge on a per question basis in the amount correct per question or as a blanket donation in the amount due column.
- The student you have sponsored will return after the test time with their test indicating their results.
- At that time, the student will collect the pledges and fill in this amount in the amount collected.
- We will be having a competition in division one (K-3) and division two (Grades 4-6). The class that raises the
 highest average per pupil when their class total is divided by the number of students will win a class PRIZE. For
 example, 1A raised \$1200, they have 23 students. Their average amount raised per pupil is \$52.
- If we raise enough money we will be purchasing a Ga-Ga Ball Pit for the school.

SAYBL presents an opportunity for boys and girls aged 8-16 years of age to play and enjoy basketball regardless of their skills or size. All the teams are balanced to keep the competition close. You and your baby can make a lasting difference in children's lives in your community!



The charity **Roots of Empathy** provides an award-winning program for elementary school children that independent research shows increases empathy, reduces aggression and bullying, and increases caring, kindness and inclusiveness.

"Change the world, child by child" by becoming a Volunteer Family

The Program is centred around you and your baby's loving relationship, with a Roots of Empathy Instructor guiding a discussion with children, encouraging them to read your baby's emotional cues and take your baby's perspective. Your baby is the "Tiny Teacher". The children learn to identify and name your baby's feelings, reflect on and understand their own feelings, then bridge to understand the feelings of others. The development of emotional literacy helps children understand how their behaviour or words can hurt others, and enables children to make friends and build positive relationships.

I would strongly recommend this program for your baby and for your community. What a way to make a difference for students by bringing the pure joy of a baby into their world.

Volunteer Roots of Empathy Parent

What's involved in being a Roots of Empathy Family:

- Nine times over the school year, you and your baby will visit a classroom with the Roots of Empathy Instructor and join the children around the "Green Blanket".
- You will help the children learn all about your baby and in turn they will learn about themselves, their feelings, and their temperament traits.
- The children will celebrate your baby's milestones such as rolling over, clapping, sitting and more, which are captured in a photo book for you and your baby. The children show their love of the baby at the end of the program with wishes for the baby's future.
